Registrants Among Us

• Registrants and those with a history of sex offending have always lived in our communities

• It's likely they live, work, and interact in every community in Minnesota



Registration

Established July 1, 1991

Administered by the MN Bureau of Criminal Apprehension (BCA)

Contents of registration:

- Addresses
- Employment
- School/vocation
- Vehicles

Registration

Registration is required if an individual is convicted, charged, or adjudicated delinquent for specific crimes:

- Criminal Sexual Conduct
- Any sexual conduct involving a minor including possession of child pornography.
- Kidnapping
- False Imprisonment

Registration

As of January 1, 2020, there were approximately **18,798** people required to register in Minnesota

- As of November 2, 2020:
 - 54 registrants in Pennington County (3)
 - *3* of those registrants in St. Hilaire (1)
 - 16 registrants in Red Lake County (0)
 - 34 registrants in Marshall County (3)
 - 161 registrants in Beltrami County (9)
 - 84 registrants in Polk County (1)

Community Notification

- Established January 1, 1997
- Minn. Stat. § 244.052

Community Notification

Applies to:

- Registrants released from prison
- Registrants from other states or federal jurisdiction who were released from prison (including military)
- Those civilly committed for sexual offense behavior

Does not apply to:

- Those with juvenile registration offense only
- Registrants sentenced to probation only

Community Notification

Department of Corrections

• Responsible for assessing risk and assigning risk levels

Law Enforcement

- Responsible for community notification
 - Scope of notification based on assigned risk level

Risk Levels

- Level 1—Lower Risk
 - -Law enforcement may notify other law enforcement agencies
 - -Law enforcement shall notify victims and witnesses of the offense
 - -Law enforcement shall notify adult household members


Risk Levels

- Level 2—Moderate Risk
 - -In addition to Level 1 notifications, law enforcement may notify individuals or organizations based on the registrant's particular offense pattern or history

Risk Levels

- Level 3—Higher Risk
 - -Broad public notification/disclosure
 - DOC public registrant website
 - Public notification meeting
 - Media (newspaper, radio, television, etc.)
 - Agency website
 - Social media
 - Door-to-door flyers


Current Risk Levels




Those subject to broad public disclosure


• As of November 2, 2020 there were **453** registrants subject to broad public disclosure residing in Minnesota communities. **8** whose address is currently unknown.


Children and Teen Victims Know the Perpetrator



Age of Victims







Date of Birth: 06/23/1987 (33)

Height: 5'8"

Weight: 162 lbs

Eyes: Blue

Hair: Black



Residence area: Vicinity of 2nd St. W and Minnesota Ave, St. Hilaire

Registrable Offense History:

Thomas Daniels engaged in sexual contact against a known, teen-aged female. Contact included penetration. Daniels used attention and affection to gain and exploit access.

2006: Criminal Sexual Conduct 3rd Degree, Pennington Co.

- Criminal sexual contact against a 15 year-old female. (Daniels 18)
- Known to victim
- Used the relationship of trust he built and exploited unmonitored contact. Used attention and affection in an attempt to maintain control.
- 18 Month Commit, 10 Year conditional release

June 2006 - entered prison

12/11/2006 Assessed and assigned RL 3

04/19/2007 Released to intensive supervision (ISR)

September 13, 2017 – discharged at expiration of sentence.

Supervision and registration requirements

- Mr. Daniels **no longer** under correctional supervision
- He will be subject to registration until 09/12/2027

Awareness and Education

- The Three 90's
 - 90% do not reoffend
 - 90% known to victim
 - 90% not previously convicted
- And the Two R's
 - It's about *relationship* not *residence*
 - Social proximity is more important than geographic proximity
